

How to become a child care provider

Type of provider

Step-by-step process

License-Exempt Provider (LEP)

Provides care for one's own (or a relative's) children and *one* other family.



The family you provide care for notifies SNCS that you are willing and able to provide care



SNCS mails you an enrollment packet



Complete and return the enrollment packet



Complete EMSA approved CPR/First Aid within 90 days of the start of service

Family Child Care Home (FCCH)

Provides care for *more* than your (or a relative's) children and one other family in your own home.



Determine your capacity: **small** (1-8 children) or **large** (9-14 children and prior experience)



Attend an [in-person](#) or [online](#) licensing orientation (\$25)



Become familiar with [licensing regulations](#)



Obtain a background clearance, TB test, EMSA approved Preventive Health & Safety and CPR/First Aid training



Submit [application](#), supporting documentation and fee (\$73 for small, \$140 for large)



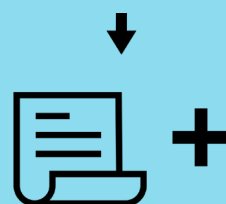
Licensing analyst completes a pre-license home inspection

Center-Based

Provides care for children in a commercial building.



Attend an [in-person](#) or [online](#) licensing orientation (\$50)



Become familiar with [licensing regulations](#) and meet additional liabilities and requirements



Obtain a background clearance, TB test, EMSA approved Preventive Health & Safety and CPR/First Aid training



Submit [application](#), supporting documentation and fee (\$484+ depending on capacity)
