How to become a child care provider

License-Exempt Provider (LEP)

Provides care for one's own (or a relative's) children and *one* other family.

Family Child Care Home (FCCH)

Provides care for children in one's own home.

Center-Based

Provides care for children in a commercial building.



The family you intend to provide care for is enrolled with SNCS and identifies you as their provider of choice



SNCS schedules an appointment to discuss and review enrollment



Complete and return the enrollment packet



Complete EMSA approved CPR/ First Aid within 90 days of the start of service

Determine your capacity: **small** (1-8 children) or **large** (9-14 children and prior experience)



Attend an <u>in-person</u> or <u>online</u> licensing orientation (\$25)



Become familiar with <u>licensing</u> regulations



Obtain a background clearance, TB test, EMSA approved Preventive Health & Safety and CPR/First Aid training



Submit <u>application</u>, supporting documentation and fee (\$73 for small, \$140 for large)



Licensing analyst completes a pre-license home inspection



Attend an <u>in-person</u> or <u>online</u> licensing orientation (\$50)



Become familiar with <u>licensing</u> regulations and meet additional liabilities and requirements



Obtain a background clearance, TB test, EMSA approved Preventive Health & Safety and CPR/First Aid training



Submit <u>application</u>, supporting documentation and fee (\$484+ depending on capacity)
